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Equipment List for Mt Aspiring - 5 days

Throughout the summer season, a full range of conditions and temperatures can be expected on a Mt Aspiring ascent. Due to the remote nature of the mountain, clients need to be suitably prepared. Your guide will do a comprehensive gear check at your pre-trip meeting. This is usually a fly-in, walk-out trip based at Colin Todd hut. You will need to carry your personal gear and will be asked to assist in carrying some food and group equipment from the heli-landing site to the hut and on the walk-out.
