



## Equipment List for Aoraki / Mount Cook - 6 days

Throughout the summer season, a full range of conditions and temperatures can be expected on an ascent of Aoraki / Mt Cook and clients need to be suitably prepared. Your guide will do a comprehensive gear check at your pre-trip meeting. This is a fly-in and out hut based trip and a duffel bag of overnight gear can be taken to the hut. On the summit day you will need to carry your personal gear and may be asked to assist in carrying some group gear.
